2 horses in Virginia have tested positive for equine herpesvirus-1, causing a neurologic disease known as equine herpesvirus myeloencephalopathy (EHM). Both horses are under quarantine. This game is a great way for the students who already know a lot about equine science and horse-care to move quickly through the phases and "own" horses and compete.
