4-H'er Spotlight

Mia & Ella Braundel

The War Horse Event Series is a series of combined training trials with levels ranging from green to advanced held at the Carolina Horse Park. The 2016 series was comprised of 5 trials, one being the end-of-year championships and a sixth trial will be added to the series for 2017. The series, which is sponsored by Adequan, Merial, Southern Pines Equine Associates, and more, partners with an organization called Warrior's Claim which partners ex-racehorses with military members to help both work through physical and mental issues. The series offers a 4-H division open to Southeast District 4-H'ers, organized by Carrie Everhart.

This month's 4-H spotlight focuses on Mia and Ella Braundel who were 2016 WHES Champion and Reserve Champion, respectively. Mia and Ella are 4-H'ers from Johnston County. Mia received a gift certificate from Cabin

Branch Tack Shop, a Championship neck ribbon, and a custom made saddle rack by Eric Moore of Raeford, awarded by the Southeast District 4-H Horse Council. Ella received a reserve champion ribbon.

We had the opportunity to interview both of these accomplished young riders. Their answers are below!

Tell us a little about yourselves.

Mia: My name is Mia Braundel, I am 16 years old, and I have participated in 4-H for six years.

Ella: My name is Ella Braundel and I am 13 years old. I have been in 4-H for 6 years now. I won the reserve championship for 4-H at the War Horse series this season.

Can you explain more about the War Horse series and what was involved?

Mia: The War Horse Event Series is 5 schooling horse trials over the competition season and ends with the Championship event in November. It is an amazing opportunity for horses and riders of all levels to come out and school dressage, cross country, and show jumping the day before competition. This way horses and riders new to

eventing get the chance to do all this without the stress of competing. Competition the next day is a fun and friendly environment while at the same time, run like a recognized event. To qualify for the Championship event you must place 1st-6th place in a horse trial division or attend all four of the previous horse trials.

Ella: The War Horse Series is an Event Series that is held in Carolina Horse Park. Any skill level, from Green as Grass to Advanced, is allowed. For the Championships in November, you had to have placed first through fifth in any of their previous events from 2016. The events held before the championships don't really have any requirements, other than the skill you have.

How did you get involved in the War Horse series?

Mia: When I got my horse, Cashmere, neither of us had ever evented before. So that summer, I chose our first ever horse trial to be the War Horse event in July. We schooled cross country the day before and had an amazing experience the next day at our first horse trial. Ever since then, I love attending all the War Horse events with my horses.

Ella: I got involved in the War Horse Series when I first began eventing on my pony Pepperwood Swarovski. We needed a safe place to start eventing, a place where I could gain experience and confidence. War Horse was perfect, because it was a schooling show, and many people from our barn and our trainer had previously gone before. We signed up and made the great decision to keep coming back.

Tell us more about your horses (breed, age, etc.).

Mia: My horse, Cashmere, is a 9 year old, 17 hand, Dutch Warmblood. When I first got him he had only ever done dressage and had never jumped before. Over the summer I worked with him and began teaching him to jump. At first it was a challenge but he proved to be very talented. We competed in our first event, the War Horse schooling show, in July of 2015, at Beginner Novice. This year we are moving up to the Preliminary level and our goal for next year is the Junior/Young Rider Championships in 2017.

Ella: My horse, Do you Believe in Magic, was pulled out of a field and trained to event by her previous owner. We aren't sure of her breeding but we think she is a black and white paint. We think she has a western background. She likes to do reining stops when we halt and salute in dressage.

What is the name of your 4-H club and who is your 4-H leader?

Mia and Ella: Our 4-H group is called the JoCo Rockin' Riders, or leader is Chris Williams. We have 12 members, five of which do eventing and compete in the War Horse Series.

What other 4-H events are you involved in?

Mia: I have gone to County Council meetings, Volunteering, 4-H Public Speaking, and club meetings.

Ella: We participate in the County Council meetings, Speech Contest, Sweets and Treats, Volunteering, and the art contest.

New Ranch Division Offered in 2017

After 2 years of being invitational/non-qualifying classes, Ranch will become a qualifying division for the State 4-H Horse Show and will award a Champion and Reserve Champion at the 2017 NC State 4-H Horse Show. In addition, the Ranch Champion will earn a Southern Regional 4-H Horse Show slot to represent NC. The 2017 NC State 4-H Horse Show will offer the following Ranch classes that will count towards Champion:

Ranch Ground Handling Ranch Horsemanship Ranch Trail Ranch Rail Pleasure Ranch Riding

Class descriptions, rules and scoring systems for these classes will be included in the revised version of the *NC 4-H Horse Program Rules and Regulations Manual.* 4-H'ers wishing to enter any of these classes at the 2017 NC State 4-H Horse Show will need to qualify in one of the Ranch classes offered at the qualifying show they attend.

Proper Use of the 4-H Name and Emblem

As you begin developing 4-H materials for 2017, please take a few minutes to brush up on the proper use of the 4-H name and emblem. The National 4-H Headquarters has developed a fact sheet with numerous examples of correct and incorrect emblem usage. If you and your club create pamphlets, t-shirts, advertisements, etc., be sure to follow the proper use guidelines on your items. Here are a few highlights and common errors:

 The official 4-H Name includes 4-H, 4-H Youth Development, or 4-H Youth Development Program. When using the term "4-H" it must conform as follows: Numeral "4" separated from a capital "H" with a hyphen (not a dash, slash or space).

Correct: 4-H Incorrect: 4H Incorrect: 4-h

 Don't place text or other images over or on top of the 4-H Emblem. The 4-H Emblem should not appear screened under words or graphics. No photo, drawing, symbol, word or other figure or object may be placed on or obscure the 4-H Emblem. This includes on web pages, where it should not appear as a "watermark" behind other information.


Practice Horse Bowl Question
