her challenges and as a result, they changed their policy of champion prize giving after that first year!

2016 NC STATE 4-H HORSE SHOW

July 6-10, 2016

For information regarding the 2016 NC State 4-H Horse Show, please visit the <u>State Show</u> page on the NCSU Equine Husbandry website. The page has exhibitor information and forms, schedules, Dressage entry information, vendor and advertisement forms, and more.

ENTRY DEADLINES

Entries for the State 4-H Horse Show are due shortly after the conclusion of your qualifying show. Postmark deadlines are as follows:

May 11 - for those that qualified at the East and West shows

May 25 - for those that qualified at the South show

June 1 - for those that qualified at the North show

ROOM ACCOMODATIONS

The host hotel for the 2016 NC State 4-H Horse Show is <u>Wingate by Wyndham</u> (PNC/NC STATE). The room rate is \$82.00 per night plus tax. 45 rooms have been reserved for the State Show on a first-come basis. Please call 919-809-8660 and request the NC State 4-H Horse Show room block. The cut-off for this room block is June 5, 2016.

CLINICS

The 2016 NC State 4-H Horse Show will once again offer Pattern Lecture-Clinics. Hunter Over Fences will take place immediately following the conclusion of the Adaptive Riding Classes, in the Main Arena, on Wednesday, July 6. Horsemanship and Showmanship will tentatively be held at 6:30 in the outdoor arena behind F Barn, also on July 6.

2016 ARTISTIC EXPRESSION AND CREATIVE WRITING CONTESTS

ARTISTIC EXPRESSION

The 2016 Artistic Expression online entry form will be open until May 1. Use this form to register to enter the Craft, Sewing, Drawing, Poster, Painting, Photography, Digitally Enhanced/Altered Photography contests. After you enter online via the form, you will be emailed an invoice for your contest registration fees (\$3.00/contest). This invoice and the appropriate fees must be returned to NCSU by May 18 for your entry to be complete. If the entry is for a Cloverbud, there are no fees and therefore the invoice does not have to be returned; you may keep it for your records as to which contests you have entered.

Exhibits must be submitted to the NC State 4-H Horse Show on July 8 from 10 AM to 4 PM. Entries will be judged beginning at 5:00 PM. The exhibit will be open for viewing on Saturday, July 9 from 10-4. Entries must be picked up between 4-6 pm on July 9. Be sure to consult the NC 4-H Horse Program Rules and Regulations Manual for the specific rules and requirements for each contest.

CREATIVE WRITING

The 2016 Creative Writing Contest entry form and writing submission(s) must be postmarked no later than May 2, 2016. Junior and Senior 4-H'ers can submit entries in three different categories: Poetry, Short Story and Essays. First through sixth place Junior and Senior winners in each event will receive ribbons. The first place Junior and Senior winners will receive an embossed, NC 4-H Horse Program padfolio. 2016 HORSEMANSHIP CAMP

Registration is now open for the 2016 NC 4-H Horsemanship Camp that will be held June 12-17 at Camp Millstone in Ellerbe, NC. Registrations will continue to be accepted through June 1st! Special features of the camp include educational lectures, riding lessons, showmanship, judging contests, trail rides and training demonstrations. Instruction will be given in hunt seat, western and gaming styles, with additional instruction in dressage, non-trotting or eventing, if enough interest exists. Campers must supply his/her own horse, equipment, feed, and transportation. The camp will provide sawdust for the stalls. This year's camp will be open to non-4-Hers, so invite your friends!

2016 SOUTHERN REGIONAL 4-H HORSE CHAMPIONSHIPS

The 2016 Southern Regional 4-H Horse Championships will be held July 27-July 31 in Perry, GA. For the first time, the show will be organized and ran by the Southern Regional Horse Championships committee. The schedule has not yet been finalized, but will be available on both the Southern Regional and NC Extension Equine Husbandry site as soon as it is available.

CALIFORNIA CHROME BECOMES NORTH AMERICA'S RICHEST RACEHORSE



A year after finishing second, California Chrome returned to the Dubai World Cup to win in brilliant fashion. The 2014 Kentucky Derby and Preakness winner set a new track record of 2:01.83 for the 2,000 meter race at Meydan Racecourse. Even more incredible? He did it with his saddle slipped back to his flank! Jockey Victor Espinoza (who rode American Pharoah to his 2015 Triple Crown win) proved his athleticism in keeping his balance while guiding the flashy chestnut home in the \$10 million race. The winner's share of the purse, \$6 million, boosted California Chrome's lifetime earnings to \$12,532,650, eclipsing the 2008 Dubai World Cup Winner, Curlin's, lifetime earnings of \$10.5 million. Chrome returned home to America where he is now aiming at the Breeders' Cup Classic in November.

The Judges Card

REINING CLASS REASONS AND SCORECARD

The Reining Class was placed 4-1-3-2 with cuts of 2-2-6. The first place horse simply accrued the fewest penalty points and the bottom horse received a zero score.

Both 4 and 1 spun the fastest with the most stationary pivot foot. However, both 4 and 1 overspun to the left, receiving a 1 point penalty.

Horse 1 received a 2 break of gait penalty point penalty for performing a simple lead change to the right.

Horse 3 received two, 1 point penalties for a delayed lead change both directions. In addition to those penalties, Horse 3 lost maneuver points for being slow in the spins, lacking differentiation in speed in the circles and stopping hard on forehand.

Horse 2 received a zero score for failing to complete 4 spins to the right. This horse also broke gait twice during the lead changes and lacked the speed and finesse of the horses placed above him.




