Parking

No trailers or campers will be allowed to park and set up next to the barns. With campers/trailers parked next to the barns, there is not enough access for emergency vehicles to pass unobstructed in the event of an emergency. This is a violation of fire code. There are no changes to open trailer/ camper parking.

Note: Trinity Road is under construction from Blue Ridge to just before Youth Center Road.

This means that you cannot access the Horse Complex if you turn from Blue Ridge Road onto Trinity. You can access Youth Center Drive from Hillsborough Street and go all the way to the end and take a left onto Trinity. Most people will probably elect to enter the Horse Complex by using Edwards Mill Road and then turning onto Trinity. You can use Trinity to access gate H4 or the main entrance into the paved parking lot.

Pattern Demo & Lectures

The NC State 4-H Horse Show is proud to offer a Horse-manship Pattern Demo & Lecture at this year's show. The lecture/clinic is free to exhibitors and will be taught by members of the NCSU Western Equestrian Team. The lecture/clinic will cover what the judges are looking for when judging/scoring the class; advice for performing the horse show patterns; and a question and answer session. It is free and open to anyone-just show up at the location and time! Demonstration horses and riders may be used to show an example pattern, but these events are lectures only and participants will not need to bring their horses to the clinic. **Horsemanship**- Thursday in the Covered Arena from 6:30-7:30

2018 Southern Regional 4-H Horse Championships

IMPORTANT: 2018 Southern Regional 4-H Horse Show entries will close PROMPTLY AT 12:00 Noon at the State 4-H **Horse Show Office on Sunday** July 8, 2018. All entries must be submitted by this deadline and location. NO LATE EN-TRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED **BEYOND THE 12:00 Noon DEADLINE** . All 4-H members, regardless of participation at the State Show, including points earned, are eligible to enter the and must do so by the 12 noon deadline whether they have or have not finished showing. Priority will be given to entries according to rules listed in the 4-H Horse **Program Rules and Regulations** Manual. If at the end of the show, the 4-H member no longer intends on showing at Southern Regionals

or does not qualify, entries and checks will be returned. The Extension Horse Husbandry (EHH) office will forward all qualified entries to the host state by Tuesday July 10, 2018. EHH must be notified of any changes, scratches, or cancellations prior to 9:00 am on Tuesday July 10, 2018. All NC Southern Regional delegation members will continue to receive the traditional NC 4-H Horse Program T-shirt at the event. Dependent on budget, additional horserelated items may also be provided to show exhibitors. In addition to those Southern Regional 4-H Horse Show exhibitors that are eligible to compete in Travelodge Perry GA the divisions offered at the State 4-H Horse Show, one spot is reserved for a 4-H member that would like to compete in the Roping events. This article from Horse and Rider written by Jeffery Gibbs, operator Gibbs Show Horses out of Collinsville, Texas and Abigail Boatwright demonstrates how to Perfect your horse's turnaround with these help-

ful tips and troubleshooting pointers. The pivot maneuver builds on the concept of steering, because cueing your horse to pivot is asking him to move left or right by steering. In the show pen, a good pivot will line you up for the rest of your pattern. A bad pivot can set off a chain reaction for further mistakes—missed markers or crooked departures that take away from the rest of your pattern—resulting in a poor score.
