#### Hunter

Attire: Long sleeved, collared shirt; Breeches (breeches are to be of traditional shades of buff, khaki, canary, light grey, or rust (or jodhpurs)); Field boots or paddock (jodhpur) boots of black or brown; ASTM Approved Helmet; Hair must be neat and contained (as in a net or braid)

Optional: Hunt Coat, Tie or Choker, Gloves, Spurs, Crops.

  - Senior Horse & Pony, Junior Horse & Pony, Little Britches
    - Showmanship
    - Horsemanship
    - Trail

**Attire:** Long sleeved collared shirt, blouse or jacket; ASTM Approved Helmet in riding classes (hat or helmet optional for showmanship); Jeans, slacks or trousers; **NO CHAPS** in Horsemanship (it makes it very difficult to judge leg position via video); Boots with a functional heel





- Ranch
  - Senior Horse & Pony, Junior Horse & Pony
    - Ground Handling
    - Horsemanship
    - Ranch Riding

**Attire:** Long sleeved collared shirt, blouse or jacket; ASTM Approved Helmet in riding classes (hat or helmet optional for ground handling), Jeans, slacks or trousers;, **NO CHAPS OR CHINKS** in Horsemanship (it makes it very difficult to judge leg position via video); Boots with a functional heel





- Speed Events
  - Senior Horse & Pony, Junior Horse & Pony
    - Texas Barrels
    - Stake Race
    - Single Marker Arena Race

**Attire**: Long sleeved, collared shirt; ASTM Approved Helmet; long pants; Boots with a functional heel





- Saddleseat
  - Senior and Junior
    - Showmanship
    - Equitation
    - Pleasure
- Non-Trotting
  - Senior and Junior
    - Showmanship
    - Equitation
    - Pleasure 2 -gait, english or western (trail walk, pleasure gait, extended pleasure gait)





#### Saddleseat

Attire: Long sleeved, collared shirt; jodhpurs; Paddock or jodhpur boots; ASTM Approved Helmet; Optional: Suit coat/day coat, vest, tie, gloves, spurs, crops.

#### Non-Trotting

- Western: Attire: Long sleeved collared shirt, blouse or jacket; ASTM Approved Helmet in riding classes (hat or helmet optional for showmanship); Jeans, slacks or trousers; NO CHAPS in Equitation (it makes it very difficult to judge leg position via video); Boots with a functional heel
- English: Attire: Long sleeved, collared shirt; jodhpurs; Paddock or jodhpur boots; ASTM Approved Helmet; Optional: Suit coat/day coat, vest, tie, gloves, spurs, crops.



- Adaptive
  - Showmanship
  - Equitation

**Attire:** Long sleeved, collared shirt; ASTM Approved Helmet; long pants; Boots with a functional heel



- Cloverbud
  - Showmanship
  - Equitation
  - Costume

**Attire:** follow the rules listed for your division listed above (western, hunter, saddleseat, ranch, or non-trotting)





- Dressage
  - Can pick a maximum of 3 and can only do 2 consecutive level tests:
    - Dressage Suitability
    - Dressage Equitation
    - USDF Intro B
    - Training Level 1
    - First Level 1
    - Western Dressage (WDAA) Intro Test 1







- For both platforms (APHA and Better Dressage Scores) be sure that you use the links we provide so you are entering OUR show.
- Both sites host multiple shows at a time, so you need to make sure you are using the link provided on our site.



- All Non Dressage classes are \$15 each. For an additional \$15, you can get individualized, verbal feedback about your run from the judge.
- Dressage classes & tests are \$19 each. For an additional \$9, you can get individualized, verbal feedback about your run/test from the judge.

#### **General Pattern Set Up and Filming Guidelines**


- 1. Follow the class' posted pattern/format and class filming guidelines; failure to do so is grounds for disqualification. All videos must be recorded horizontally.
- 2. Videos must show a continuous shot, and clips may not be edited together.
- Each video should only include one "entry" for a single class.
- 4. Videos must begin with the camera operator, announcing the name of the class, the exhibitor's name, the horse's name, and the date.
- 5. For any class requiring a "marker" for part of the pattern, the following are acceptable markers (just make sure they are easily visible on camera):
  - a. Cones
  - b. Buckets
  - c Plants/Flower Pots

- Showmanship:
  - Exhibitors must have either a person to serve as the inspection judge or have the camera operator walk for inspection while keeping the exhibitor's positioning in frame at all times. If using a separate inspection judge, they should remain behind the camera before and after inspection. When it is time for inspection, the judge should walk around the horse counter-clockwise.




Showmanship Inspection



2020 NC State 4-H Virtual Horse Show Saddle Seat Showmanship

Show Date: July 2020





Be ready at 1.

- 1. Walk from 1 to 2.
- 2. Stop at 2. Back 4 steps.
- 3. Trot past 2 and to judge.
- 4. Stop; set up for inspection.
- 5. After inspection, perform a 270° turn to the right.
- 6. Trot to 3.
- 7. Halt at 3. Pet your horse to show completion of the pattern.

#### C=Camera

Cone 1 to 2: Approx. 30 feet. Cone 1 across to Camera: Approx. 70ft (Measurements are merely guidelines to help you while setting your pattern)

Exhibitors must have either a person to serve as the inspection judge or have the camera operator walk for inspection while keeping the exhibitor's positioning in frame at all times. If using a separate inspection judge, they should remain behind the camera before and after inspection. When it is time for inspection, the judge should walk around the horse counterclockwise.



Details about measurements between cones are listed on the patterns



#### **Hunter Hack**

- 1. Fences must meet the following specifications:
  - a. Approximately 2' high
  - b. Must collapse/fall down/move safely if they are hit (both standards and rails). If using rails, rails MUST be able to detach from the jumps if hit.
  - c. Any jump that is deemed unsafe by the judges will be disqualified. Examples of unsafe jumps include (but not limited to):
    - i. Cinder blocks with rails placed in the holes so they can't collapse if hit
    - ii. Using unsteady items/items that legs can get caught in for standards (lawn chairs, etc.)
    - iii. Wooden pallets that have holes where legs can get caught



#### **Hunter Hack**

- Traditional standards and rails are ideal, but we understand that not every youth will have access to these items. Acceptable substitute items for fences include the following:
  - a. Hay/straw bales
  - b. Barrels or buckets that do not have handles (no legs getting caught!) that meet the height requirements



#### Trail

Each pattern requires 6 poles and 6 markers.

- a. Poles may be natural or painted and are not required to match in color/design. Poles must be a solid object (cannot be spray painted as a marker on the ground).
- b. Markers may be any of the following items (just make sure they are visible on camera easily!)
  - i. Cones (small soccer cones from Amazon or Walmart work great and are cheap!)
  - ii. Buckets
  - iii. Plants/flower pots



#### Trail

c. The slicker may be any type of jacket, rain jacket, or small tarp. The slicker may be mounted on a fence, jump standard, mailbox, or may be held up by a human (must be held by an outstretched arm lifted higher than their head).



#### Speed Events

- The video begins with the camera operator announcing the name of the class, the exhibitor's name, the horse's name, and the date.
- The camera operator will then show all of the measurements listed on the pattern for the class. You must do this for each run (can't do it once and then clip together for the next rider). We understand that this is tedious, but this is the only way to ensure that everything is run as fairly as possible, as speed events are very tricky to do virtually. Must start and stop within a closed "gate" (may not use an alleyway).



#### Speed Events

• The camera operator will film from the timer line. A timer MUST BE VISIBLE in the video for the entire run at the bottom of the screen. We suggest either a stopwatch/smart watch as they are smaller than another phone. The horse/pony/rider combo must also be visible in the screen the entire run (before crossing the time and after) to ensure that the pattern is being followed in accordance to the rules. We suggest practicing this a time or two before actually filming for competition to figure out timer placement in the video. The timer starts/stops when the horse's nose crosses the finish line. The horse/pony/rider combo completes their run.




#### Speed Events

- Time is verbally announced on the video by the camera operator.
- Immediately after the run, the horse/pony/rider combo must present
  to the camera to show that no rubber bands are on their boots.
  They must stay in the frame of the video until this point to ensure
  that they are not removing bands from their boots while off camera
  (it is OK if this is from a bit of a distance, as long as the judge can
  see that they are not altering their equipment).
- Filming ends for that run.




- 1. You may start on either side of the start/finish line, but you must end on the opposite side and stay within the markers as shown.
- 2. The distance from the timer line to the first barrel is 30 feet.
- 3. The distance between the start/finish line markers is 20 feet.
- 4. The distance between the first and second, and second and third barrel is 60 feet.
- 5. Time starts and ends when the horse's nose crosses the start/finish line.
- 6. The timer should be in view of the camera from start to finish.


Stake Race Show Date: July, 2020



- 1. You may start on either side of the start/finish line, but you must end on the opposite side and stay within the markers as shown.
- 2. The distance between the start/finish line markers is 20 feet (10 fee from center line to marker).
- 4. The distance between the poles (you may also use barrels) is 80 feet.
- 5. Time starts and ends when the horse's nose crosses the start/finish line.
- 6. The timer should be in view of the camera from start to finish.

#### 2020 NC State 4-H Horse Show

Arena Race Show Date: July, 2020



- 1. Any route may be used to and from the finish line.
- 2. The exhibitor must make a complete pass, behind the barrel or pole (from either side) and must stay within the start/finish markers as shown.
- 3. The distance from the timer line to the barrel or pole is 100 feet.
- 4. The distance between the start/finish line markers is 20 feet.
- 5. Time starts and ends when the horse's nose crosses the start/finish line.
- 6. The timer should be in view of the camera from start to finish



# **Dressage**



Letters must be used for arenas for tests, but can be creative (marker on paper taped to a bucket, etc.)

Corners must be used for arenas for tests.

For suitability and equitation no letters/dressage arenas required.
